	DESCRIPTION OF DISCUSSION
1	Called to order at 7:05 p.m.
2	Lisa Hopp welcomed guests.
3	Approval of the minutes of the May general meeting was postponed until the October general meeting.
4	Sue Kerr gave an update for the Board of Education. The 2018 Summer Reading Challenge, in partnership with local library districts, had almost 3700 U-46 elementary students participate. Lincoln Elementary and Washington Elementary received special recognition at a recent BOE meeting.  The Bartlett Hawks played their inaugural football game under the lights 2 weeks ago. The new Bartlett High School Activity Complex features a press box, lighting, and permanent bleacher seating for 1500 fans, in addition to the field.  The 11 <sup>th</sup> annual Principal for a Day event will take place on December 7. If interested in participating, contact Karla Jimenez, Coordinator of Family & Community Engagement, at karlajimenez@u-46.org. Explore 2018 Career Expo was help yesterday at the Sears Centre. Nearly 3000 eighth graders attended with their classes during the school day. 86 industry and business partners participated. Middle school counselors will do follow-up lessons with students. Organizers are looking for a way to incorporate parents in next year's event and possibly include high school students. (Slideshow from Explore was shown.) U46Engage informational sessions for kindergarten parents will be held on September 20 (English) and September 25 (Spanish) at Elgin High School Library.
5	Tony Sanders gave an update for District Administration. Tony introduced members of his cabinet (Dr. Suzanne Johnson, Dr. Jeff King, Dr. Ushma Shah, Dr. Josh Carpenter, Lela Majstorovic, Melanie Meidel, Ron Raglin, Brian Lindholm, and Mary Fergus) and more than 20 school principals in attendance. Pathways feedback has been appreciated. Administration will be sharing an updated proposal on Educational Pathways with the Board of Ed. on September 24. The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) will mean some changes for the School Report Card coming out in October. On October 2, admin will present a high school overview of ESSA and the School Report Cards. U-46 is anticipating approx. \$42 million in new funding this year. We have invested in Chromebooks for all high schoolers, brought back middle school counselors, and have been working toward staffing grades K-2 at a maximum of 28 students per class. Admin will be focusing this year on a data review at each school with school leadership and School Improvement Plan (SIP) teams. They will also look at how 1:1 tech devices are being used and accreditation for all district schools as an extra layer of accountability.
